# Mental Health and Addictions Services in Champlain and the South-East

Update

November 2022

In March 2021, le Réseau des services de santé en français de l'Est de l'Ontario published a capacity analysis regarding French-language Mental Health and Addictions (MHA) services in the Champlain region. The recommendations from the initial report were reviewed with a specific focus on virtual services in MHA. In addition, the South-East region now being overseen by Ontario Health East, services for this region were added to the update. All recommendations highlighted in orange are new.



# Western Champlain

### Addictions

The following actions are recommended:

Explore the maximisation of Renfrew Victoria Hospital's service offer for Francophones in the region.

• Identify Mackay Manor for designation of its Addictions Treatment services in a residential setting.

#### Mental Health

The following action is recommended:

That local authorities put accountability mechanisms in place towards Pembroke Regional Hospital to foster progress in the designation process as soon as possible. The programs to include are the following:

- 1. Residential/Inpatient Programs
- 2. Community Clinics/Programs:
  - Counselling
  - ACTT
  - Diversion and Court Support
  - Crisis Intervention
- 3. Other Non Residential Services
  - Centralized/Coordinated Access
  - Case Management
  - Consumer Survivor/Family Initiatives

That Le Réseau collaborate with Ontario Health to review the partnership model being developed for the Kingston region (via the Ontario Telemedicine Network), aimed at providing mental health services in French; this model could potentially be adapted to the Western Champlain area.

# Global Recommendations

- Virtual MHA services are growing in popularity. It is recommended that the needs of Francophones be considered with each step of the development and implementation of these tools, with both telemedicine systems and virtual applications.
- In order to obtain an integral view of MHA services, it is recommended that the current work be continued with agencies outside of the scope of this analysis, in order to truly identify any gaps in service.
- All recommendations regarding in-person services outlined in the initial report remain relevant; access to services in French should be prioritized in the mental health and addictions sector.
