Cynthia is currently the Vice President, Strategy Planning and Integration and the Acting Vice President, Home and Community Care in Ontario Health (East). She is a highly respected and seasoned health care executive with a profound interest and passion for the health and well-being of the East Region. Cynthia is widely recognized for her experience in planning and home and community care. She has consistently demonstrated a deep commitment to improving how patients and families navigate the health care system through active engagement and planning with clinicians, health care partners, stakeholders and communities.

From her initial role as an Integration Consultant in the South East LHIN in 2007, Cynthia has assumed progressively senior responsibilities, including leading the development of integrated health system plans and implementing complex regional initiatives. She was a provincial co-lead for the pan-LHIN VP Planning & Integration Table, the Mental Health and Addictions Systems Table and is the LHIN representative on the Joint Provincial Nursing Council. Prior to working at the LHIN, Cynthia served as a nursing officer in the Canadian Forces where she held various roles from clinical care to operational deployment oversight of all aeromedical evacuations. She deployed overseas twice; as a critical care nurse with the 1 Canadian Field Hospital during the Gulf War, and as an aeromedical evacuation team member supporting Canada's mission in Rwanda. After 21 years of proud service she retired as the Commanding Officer of the medical clinic at CFB Trenton.

In addition to her nursing degree, Cynthia holds a Master of Sciences in Health Science and a CHE designation with the Canadian College of Health Leaders.
